California School Climate, Health, and Learning Surveys

Purpose

- Provide local data to schools, districts, and partner communities to improve student achievement and socio-emotional, behavioral, and physical health.

Three Stakeholder Surveys

- Student (California Healthy Kids Survey)
- Staff (California School Staff Survey)
- Parent (California School Parent Survey)

CaSCHLS Features

- Stakeholder Comparability
- Flexibility
 - standardized yet customizable
- Comprehensive
- Psychometrically Valid
- Cost Effective
- Drawn from strength-based resilience and youth development framework
- Aligned with Local Control and Accountability Priorities
- Student subgroups
- Geographic comparability
 - State, County, District, School
- Extensively Used
- Established Infrastructure
- Technical Support

CaSCHLS Use (2013-2015)

Survey	Districts	Schools	Respondents
Student (CHKS)	690	4,696	1,072,537
Staff	425	2,691	71,518
Parents (2015-17)	210*	1,902*	195,065*

CaSCHLS Biennial Survey

- CHKS Core Module and AOD Module administered to a randomly selected statewide sample of schools
- Results representative of the state
- District & communities can use statewide results to interpret their own results

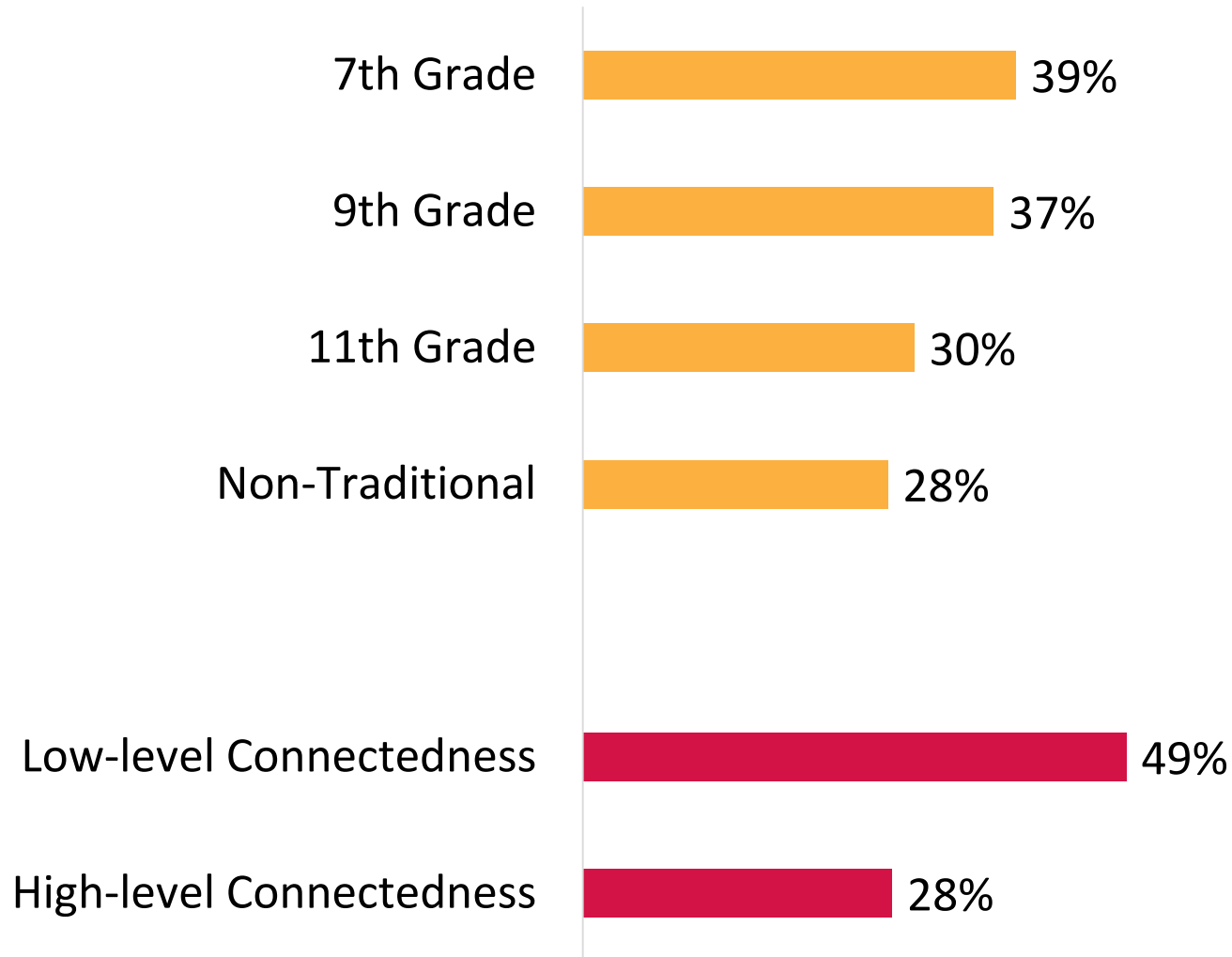

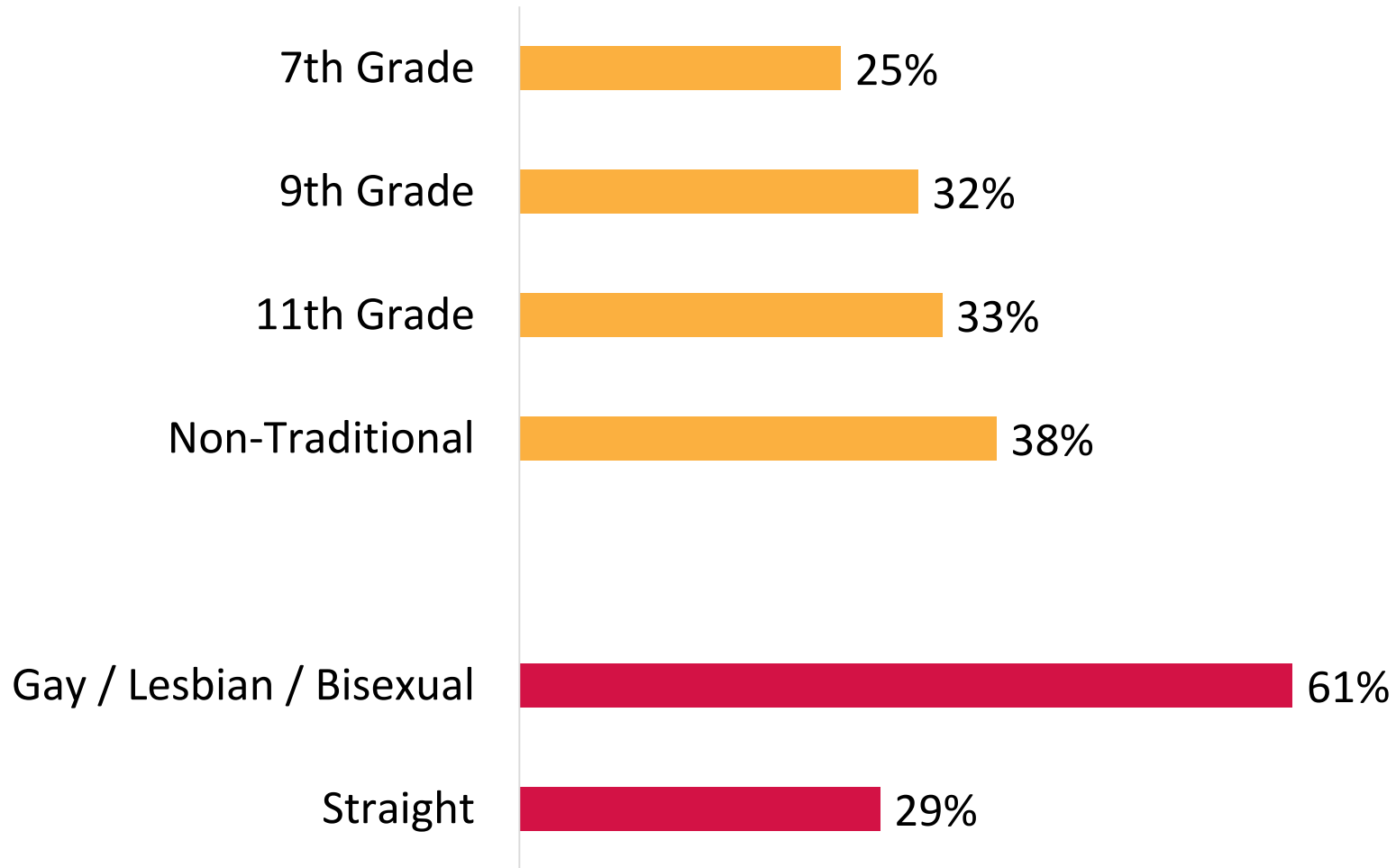

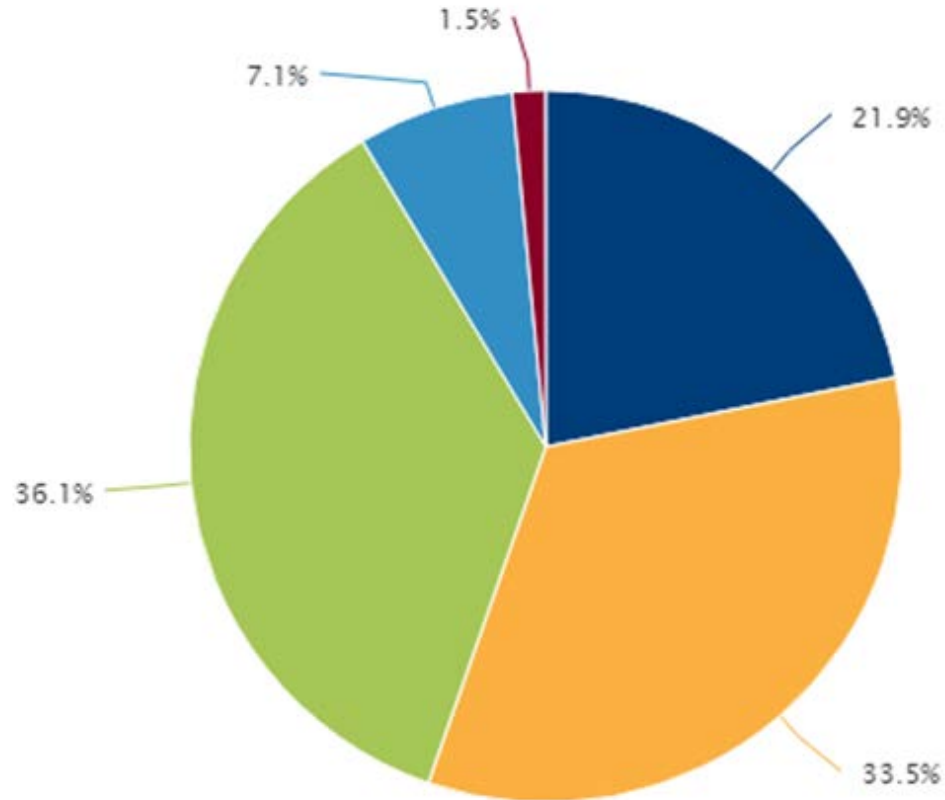
